Message from the Principal

This month, we wanted to focus on three important aspects of our school community: attendance, breakfast, and the school budget.

DAILY ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance at school is absolutely essential to receiving a high-quality education. When a child is absent, he/she misses that day's instruction, a precious opportunity is lost. Even if a student completes the homework assigned that day, it is not a substitute for the direct instruction provided by the teacher. To function and succeed in life, our children must receive a high-quality education. Attendance at school every day is the key to school success for every child.

Our average daily attendance is 94%. Our school goal is 95%. There is still time for us to improve our attendance and ensure that each student attends school at least 95% of the time. Thank you to parents and guardians who ensure that their child arrives every day and on time. It helps set the foundation for learning.

EAT BREAKFAST AT SCHOOL!

Please remember that breakfast is served at school every day from 8:00 - 8:30 in the cafeteria. School breakfast will give your child a healthy start to the day. A nutritious breakfast helps students be more alert so they can learn more in class. Breakfast has vitamins and nutrients for a strong and healthy body. Help your child start the day right with school breakfast! Please remind your child that a healthy breakfast is the first step to ensuring a productive school day.

Registration hours at Pollock are from 9:30 am - 1:00 pm daily

All children must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2018

Documents that Parents MUST Bring:

- Your child's up to date immunization record
- Parent/Legal Guardianship Identification: Current Drivers/Non-Drivers License, Federal/State/Municipal photo identification, or Passport
- Child's birth certificate (additional accepted documents can be found on the school district website)
- Two current proofs of address in the parent or guardian's name. (a list of accepted documents can be found on the school district website)

- An additional Open House will be held the week of May 7th (date to be determined)

The PSSAs are coming! The PSSAs are coming!

Attention all parents of students in grades 3 through 6. The PSSA testing begins in April. The schedule for testing is as follows:

- April 9, 10, & 11 ELA
- April 16 & 17 Math
- April 23 & 24 Science (4th Grade only)

We have only one month left to prepare our students for this important test. Our teachers have been hard at work preparing your children since September so that they have the academic skills necessary to ensure success; we are depending on you to help your children Be Proactive in getting ready for this test as well!

Get enough rest: Don't wait until April to start. Have your child put their tablets, phones, or other activities away at least 30 minutes prior to bed. Encourage your child to get to bed early so they get a full night's sleep and they are ready to start their day on a positive note!

Get to school by 8:35: Students MUST be in school prior to the start of testing or they will have to wait in the auditorium until the testing session is over. Students who come to school late will take their test later in the day - this means that they will be missing valuable instruction.

Eat a good breakfast each and every morning: Another great reason to bring your child to school prior to 8:35! We have a free and healthy breakfast available from 8:00 until 8:30 for every student.

More information will be coming over the next few weeks about the PSSA testing. Please help your child ensure that they do their very best, not just on the PSSAs but everyday at school!

Hello Leaders!

As we move into March, it is important to remember what we have learned about the 7 Habits. We have been going over the habits during morning meetings to refresh our minds and remind ourselves about how we can apply the 7 Habits to our lives.

For the month of March, let's remind ourselves about the following two habits of the Leader in Me program. Habit 4: Think Win-Win and Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to be Understood. Each of these habits may be difficult at first for students to learn and apply, but by bringing the habits home, students are much more likely to accept the habits as part of their thinking process.

If your child has siblings, they make perfect practice partners for both habits. Guide your children to working out their conflicts by thinking "win-win," where both children are happy with the result and both feel like they won, rather than making someone give up something to please the other.

You can also help your child by helping them to understand why their siblings or friends are upset before they share their feelings. Both, understanding others and sharing in a positive way, are important skills for anyone to learn! Bring the habits home this month and see the leader in each of your children!

Love for Literacy

Vocabulary refers to the words we must understand to communicate effectively. Vocabulary plays a fundamental role in the reading process, and contributes greatly to a reader's comprehension. A reader cannot understand a text without knowing what most of the words mean. Here are some suggestions to work on vocabulary at home with your child:

- Engage your child in conversations every day. If possible, include new and interesting words in your conversation.
- Read to your child each day. When the book contains a new or interesting word, pause and define the word for your child. After you're done reading, engage your child in a conversation about the book.
- Help build word knowledge by classifying and grouping objects or pictures while naming them.
- Help build your child's understanding of language by playing verbal games and telling jokes and stories.
- Encourage your child to read on his own. The more children read, the more words they encounter and learn.

- If your child qualifies for ESY, then Transportation forms will be coming home with your child this month. Even if your child is NOT attending ESY you must complete and return the form indicating whether or not your child WILL or WILL NOT attend the program.
- If your child WILL attend the ESY program, please indicate if your child needs transportation or if you will pick up and drop off your child.
- If you are not sure whether or not your child will attend the program, please indicate YES on the form and complete and return the Transportation Form to school. It is easier to remove your child from the program towards the end of the school year rather than adding your child to the list.

Volunteer Opportunities & Chaperone Information

Whether you are volunteering at our school or chaperoning your child's school trip, all parents, guests, and chaperones need to have up to date clearance information. Clearances MUST be updated annually and are only valid for one year from the date on the clearance. If you are planning on chaperoning a class trip at any time this year, please take the time to update your clearances as needed.

Dear Parents,

I'd like to remind you of the state mandates for physical and dental exams for Pennsylvania.

All student must have a physical and dental examination upon entry to school. That means either in kindergarten or at the time they are entering a Pennsylvania school for the first time. After those entry level exams, physicals are again required in 6th and 9th grade in Philadelphia. In other parts of the state the high school physical is not required until 11th grade. After your child's entry dental exam, additional dental exams are required in 3rd and 7th grades.

I hope this information is helpful in your planning for your child's doctor and dental appointments. The required school district forms will be sent home with your child in June if they are entering into a grade that requires an examination in the following school year.
